

Motion 27: 2013/14: Amend Standing Rule H-7 to read: The Sweepstakes Judge who ballots the highest number shall first be offered the National Specialty assignment. If declined, he/she shall be offered the Regional assignment. If either assignment is declined by the two top ranked sweepstakes judges, the individual who ballots the next highest number shall then be offered the remaining assignment.

The Sweepstakes Judge for the Regional Specialty may then exhibit at the National

Specialty. The Sweepstakes Judge for the National Specialty may not exhibit during the Regional or National Specialty, nor can they have contact with exhibitors or judges prior to their assignment. In addition, they may not attend or take part in any event where exhibitors they may judge may be in attendance with the exception of the Annual Meeting. If attending the annual meeting, the judge will have no direct communication with members who will be exhibiting during the National Specialty. No member of their immediate household may exhibit during the National Specialty, and no dog owned or co-owned by them may be shown during the National Specialty. However, members of their household may exhibit at the Regional Specialty and dogs owned or coowned by them may be exhibited as well. (Mar09)

Background: Allowing the top ranked sweepstakes judge the choice between the National or Regional assignment has been a common practice for several years but was not documented in the Standing Rules.

Motion 28: 2013/14: Authorize the Health Committee to offer a \$50 rebate for every new Coat Funk (Alopecia) sample deposited with CHIC, to be reimbursed from the General Fund up to \$2400. (Anderson) FOR: ALL

Background: The rebate is designed to encourage participation in the Alopecia research program by partially offsetting owner expenses for diagnosis, sampling and shipping.

Motion 29: 2013/14: Effective with the 2014 Regional and National Specialties, each sweepstakes judge shall be granted one complimentary night's lodging, a complimentary meal during the day of their assignment, and one complimentary banquet meal. Future contracts will include these provisions.

Legislative Committee Report Sue Maranto-Carnall mailto:yukonsue@cox.net

Pet industry heavyweights - the Pet Industry Joint Advisory Council (PIJAC), the Pet Food Institute (PFI), both in Washington, D.C. and World Pet Association (WPA) located in Monrovia, California are jointly funding a Purdue University research project that aims to develop and implement a pilot project, and evaluate science-based standards for the care and welfare of dogs raised by commercial breeders.

PIJAC donated \$200,000 to this study while the PFI and WPA didn't disclose their funding amounts. Candace Croney, Ph.D., Director of Purdue University's Center for Animal Welfare Science, will lead a two-year research study to improve commercial dog breeding standards. Thea King, past president of the Oklahoma Pet Professionals, stated legitimate breeders are already regulated to death. Dr. Croney sees a problem with the way dog breeding is currently being managed, especially at the state level. King went on to say that sketchy dog breeders won't adopt any new guidelines, especially if they are not legislatively mandated. They'll say "Stay out of my business and I have a .22". King said that has happened in Oklahoma. PFI said they will have new standards for dog breeders by fall 2014, and the evaluation process will begin shortly after. PIJAC wants animal rights activists to participate.

The Legislative Committee is concerned when organizations won't disclose funding information. The definition of commercial breeders has not been identified, which is another concern since commercial breeders are already heavily regulated by the USDA-APHIS. As of this writing, the AKC has not taken a position.

"What is the best piece(s) of advice you've received regarding training or competing with your malamute?"

Collected by Amy Novak

"Malamutes are different: Never drill them, never force them; that's not how they roll. A good working relationship started in hiking, packing, sledding or skijoring is a great start. You'll see how they think and learn. From there, find a good training facility that has no prejudice against northern breeds (as we all know, those exist). With a great bond with your dog and good instruction and perseverance, you can do anything." - Kim Sullivan

"In agility, look at the obstacle/jump the way your dog will. See what he's going to see and then develop your plan from there. In rally, practice 1-2 levels above what you're trialing at and on challenging courses. When you get to the trial, it will be cake." - Jen Effler

"Treat your dog like a true partner and work together for the common goal. Don't repeat the same exercise more than 3 or 4 times per training session. Have faith the dog understands what you want even if he/she is not giving a perfect result at that time; sometimes they just need to think it over. And most importantly – leave your ego at the ring gate." -Julia Cole

"My obedience instructor ALWAYS says, "Breathe when you enter the ring. Even if you don't the rest of the course, you had one good breath." I have listened to that for almost 20 years now. As I enter the ring, be it obedience or rally, I remember. "Alicia

says *Breathe*" and then I start." - Jane Palinkas

"I had Belgian Tervuren for many years before I got my first malamute, Joker. He was best suited for agility and did well. When Morgan came along I decided to get serious about obedience. By the time we reached the utility ring, she had taught me to not be so serious and to relax and enjoy the ride...and I did!" - Connie Jankowski

"For obedience or agility, you better be fun and entertaining or your mal will!" - Pam Renock

"During a run at a trial, keep your forward motion; don't stop to repeat an obstacle or redo it. With a mal who is only doing this for the payback at the end, it is NO FUN! Drive past the last obstacle as though there were more. Don't take your foot off the gas too soon or assume you have "done it" and start the party. Many a good run has been NQ'd as a result. At class I'm constantly reminded that I'm driving a Mack truck, so give him room, don't crowd him, and steer him! He is NOT a Border Collie! Another thought, know the course or your mal will make one up!"- Gail Lawson

"Before releasing your dog always breathe in and then let out, turn and smile at your dog, have fun.....go." -Dorrit Evensen

- "On the day of your debut and thereafter, you will be certain that your dog is groomed nicely for his appearance in the ring, as you will be.
- Remember, this is what you do for fun.
 When the judge asks if you are ready,
 check your dog, look that judge right
 in the eye, and say (as well as mean),
 "We're ready!"
- Practice that footwork. What you are doing with your dog is dancing; don't let it be you who missteps and ruins your team's performance.
- 4. I put my dog at risk as soon as I lead him onto the grounds with other dogs, some perhaps not as well trained as he. It is my obligation to keep him safe. It is my job to be aware of what is happening around him at all times, to know what all the other dogs, especially those working off lead, are doing. I must never be so busy with my own agenda that I lose sight of my main job, viz., keeping my pup safe."
- Muriel Dean
- "First, make sure that your instructor has a flexible approach to training. You cannot train a malamute the same way you would a Border Collie or a Golden. Ideally you start training your dog early.

- Hopefully the breeder had "toys" in the puppy yard so the pup is already familiar with some of the obstacles. If not, start as soon as you get the pup home.
 - a. The teeter (my personal nemesis): start pups on a wobble board as soon as possible.
 - b.Tunnels: are easy and fun for pups but become harder when introduced to bigger dogs.
 - c. Chute: Some dogs don't like the feel of pushing the top, so introduce a light sheet early.
 - d.Surfaces: Have the pup get used to walking on plastic, etc.
 - e. Body awareness: Have the pup walk over a flat ladder on the ground.
- Remember that the pup's growth plates will not close until at least 18 months of age, so go really light on the jumping.
- 4. Whenever you do start working with your dog, be sure to keep the introductions to all obstacles positive. Malamutes do not forget – good or bad things – so keep their experiences good.
- 5. Don't over train. Three or four weekly sessions of 10-15 minutes each are better than one hour long session. Malamutes also get bored easily, so when they do something correctly, don't drill it; move on to something else and come back to this item later on if necessary. That said, do not let them quit before doing the thing correctly!
- 6. Have someone videotape your training and trial runs and study those tapes.
- 7. Agility is a team sport. Malamutes are team animals. Be the leader and happy trials. -Peggy Anderson
 - "I think one thing that has helped me significantly is the "hidden rewards" game (See Raissa's description of her game elsewhere in this newsletter. AN), teaching your dog that a reward will come when it is not in sight. As for the rest: "Slow down, shut up", is the

- most significant advice I've ever got in dog training, from Jamie Nelson. Also, I can't emphasize enough the importance of "come and stay" in training fundamentals. I am a "stay" freak. I would be glad to share my protocols for stay and the hidden rewards game if anyone would like." -Raissa Hinman
- Keep your dog happy and wanting to do whatever the activity is. At the end of the day, you want your dog to think you're the best thing in the world – and you should feel the same about your dog!
- 2. Make a list of what you feel is important enough to make mandatory and what you feel is unimportant enough to let slide. If you think a start line stay is important, and your dog breaks it, then don't run! If you have a hard time following your own intentions, have a friend with you at trials. If you allow your dog to run after breaking a start line, or blowing a contact, or breaking a stay, or doing whatever is on your Mandatory List, pay your friend \$20. You'll decide very quickly what's important to you.
- 3. If something goes wrong in a trial, just move on and think of what happens next. "Next" being the next command of the heeling pattern or the next obstacle in agility, NOT your next run or next exercise! Don't give up on a run because one thing went wrong.
- 4. There will come a time when you'll give anything in the world for a chance to have just one more time to play with your dog, even if it would be the most humiliating and awful performance of your life. Try to keep things in perspective. Amy Novak
- "Bring your sense of humor, you will need it. Always remember your dog will love you even when you make training mistakes...your dog is just doing what you told/showed them to do." -Colleen Belanger
- "Do not take agility seriously. Your dog will feel the anxiety and in turn do something "entertaining"!
- 2. Remind yourself that it was YOU who entered the trial...not your dog!

- 3. When standing on the start line...take a deep breath and exhale...then SMILE! Go have fun because you know that your malamute surely will!
- 4. The day will come when you know that your malamute should be retired and you only have a finite number of runs so Have Fun and Laugh with Your Dog. Life is too short!" - Wendy Corr

"Remember you are doing this because you enjoy it, it is fun. If the dog is having a "stupid" day and training gets frustrating, have him do something simple, so you can reward it and then quit for the day! Forcing it will make things worse. When you're in the ring, 95% of the mistakes will be YOURS. If something goes wrong, stay positive and happy. Getting stern or angry will just confuse your dog and then all will go downhill. The most successful handlers are those who stay upbeat regardless! - Kristine Kerr

"With some mals, less is more. Repetition or drilling can demotivate, cause boredom or turn them off to the activity or venue. Keep it fun, interesting, unpredictable and incorporate play."-Mary Swinyer

"Most of the time, the handler is the problem, not the dog. 99% of mistakes that I've witnessed in the agility ring are handler errors, especially handler language communication" errors. But many handlers blame their dog for the error. Most of the time, the dog is doing his best to try to figure out what is being asked of him. It's not easy to understand a foreign language. If something goes wrong, a simple "Oops!" is sufficient, followed by an upbeat, "It's ok, let's go!" Of course, if your dog gets the zoomies in the ring, that's a different story! You will receive a lot of advice from different dog owners and trainers. Filter through the advice that feels right for you and your dog. Every dog and trainer team is unique, and what works for one may not be best for you. Trust your intuition. If you are too new to training to have intuition just yet, then just be sure to find a trainer with whom you are very comfortable." - Tammy Doukas

Understanding Agility Titles

I will not begin to approach the subject of what these all MEAN to us and our relationships with our dogs. This is an article about what they mean numerically more or less, in terms of what the dog has done with his handler.

In AKC Agility there are four classes and two levels of competing in those classes. There is AKC regular and AKC preferred.

What defines preferred? Before your dog can compete in AKC agility it has to be measured for his height at the withers by an AKC official known as a VMO (Volunteer Measuring Official). You get a jump height card, which tells you what jump height class to enter your dog in at a show. It would take another article to describe the rules there, but basically, you need to know what height class your dog will be in, based on your dog's height at the withers.

Any dog over 22" has to jump 24" etc. There are six "Regular jump height classes; 8", 12", 16" 20" 24" 26". 26" is a voluntary height. No matter how tall your dog is, to run in a Regular class, he can choose 24". If your dog is 22" or under, it can jump in the 20" class. If you have a 90 pound 26" malamute, or even most malamutes, you might think it is in your dog's best interest to take advantage of the AKC Preferred class. This allows you to jump one height lower and adds five seconds to the Standard course time.

Standard course time is determined by the judge, who wheels the course for yardage, before you run it. So, Bozo is 23" at the withers, and he measures into the 24" class. You can enter him in the Regular 24" class, or run Preferred at 20". Bozo has to run in one of those two classes, unless for some reason his owner wants to run him 26". A dog can enter a jump height higher, but never lower than his jump height card allows, unless he wants to enter the Preferred class. It is a wise choice for many malamutes.

Then classes are: Standard (courses with contact obstacles such as the A frame, table, teeter and dog walk), Jumpers with Weaves (jumps, tunnels and weave poles only), Time 2 Beat (T2B) which is a combination class where refusals are not judged, and dogs earn points to their title by being fast, and FAST which is a game where you send your dog to obstacles while you stay behind the distance line. In FAST you can make up your own course as long as you collect the required number of points along

the wav.

Until we discuss the PACH and MACH, the Regular and Preferred classes have pretty much the same titles, they are just listed differently after the dogs registered name.

For a Novice Standard title a dog needs to complete a Novice course successfully three times. The dog is then Bozo, NA (Novice Agility). If he is jumping his preferred height, he would be Bozo, NAP (Novice Agility Preferred). This is the same for Jumpers with Weaves; you have Bozo, NAJ (Novice Agility Jumpers) and Bozo, NJP (Novice Jumpers Preferred) and so on. After Novice you proceed to Open: Bozo, OA/OAJ and Bozo, OAP/OJP and to Excellent: Bozo, AX/AXJ and Bozo, AP/AJP. These are just the main classes: Standard and Jumpers with Weaves. FAST and T2B are games and I will discuss them a bit later.

So now, it gets a bit more complicated, but you LOVE agility so you are going for it. After you finish your Excellent titles, you begin collecting Master titles, points and double qualifying scores, the wondrous QQ.

A "Q" means a qualifying score on an AKC agility course. What is required to qualify would again be an entire article of its own. For example a Novice Jumpers with Weaves course consists of 14-16 obstacles. You are allowed two Refusals and zero Wrong courses. (Wrong courses are NEVER allowed in Jumpers with Weaves). You have to complete six weave poles in

Novice, but they cannot be faulted. If a dog fulfills these requirements under course time, it has a Q, a qualifying score.

When you reach the Masters level, in order to earn a MACH, you have to have 20 double qualifying scores or QQs, meaning the dog has qualified in Standard class and Jumpers with weaves class on the same day, 20 times. It is not easy to do. To qualify a Masters course you are allowed zero faults. On a Masters course there are 18-20 obstacles.

When I was a little girl, I was taken to the UN, where a guide showed us the beautiful Persian rugs on the walls there. We were told that every rug had one mistake because the women who made them believed only God was perfect. The AKC believes otherwise. A Masters title is earned by completing 10 qualifying runs in the Masters class. A dog then earns his MX or MXP, MXJ or MJP. So let's say Bozo has done all this. The correct way to list his title is as follows: Bozo, MX, MXJ. You DO NOT list all the previous titles as you cannot earn those listed without them.

While Bozo was earning his MX and MXJ he was collecting MACH pts. You can also earn a PACH. Both are prefix titles, meaning they go BEFORE the dog's name, just like a conformation championship. A MACH is a Master Agility Champion and a PACH is a Preferred Agility Champion. You earn these by collecting points earned by seconds that you qualify under course time in both the JWW and Standard classes. To earn a MACH or PACH you need 750 points

AND 20 Double qualifying scores. A QQ is earned by qualifying in both the Standard and Jumpers with Weaves Master classes on the same day It's tricky business, for sure. So when Bozo earns his MACH, he is now MACH Bozo or PACH Bozo. If you are showing in the Preferred classes, there is another suffix title you can earn: PAX, which is for 20 QQs at the preferred level with no requirement for speed points. There is no title like that at the regular level, but there is other stuff at both.

It used to be when I was showing good Sister, that if you had all your QQs and needed points, and you qualified in a Jumpers with Weaves course in course time, so that you qualified but earned 0 points, it was worth exactly nothing in the title department. This is no longer the case. After a dog has earned its MX, the next title along that road would be MXB. This is 25 qualifying scores in Masters Standard. Then there is the MXS for 50 qualifying scores, the MXG for 75 and the MXC for 100. This is also possible in the preferred class.

It gets crazier still. Let's say Bozo is now MACh 5 Bozo. He might be: MACH5 Bozo MXB3, MJS3, MXF, TQX. What does THAT all mean?? MXB3 is calculated as follows: MXB=25 Master Standard Qs. MXB2= 125 Qs and MXB3=225 Qs. It's crazy but possible. As for the rest, MJS3 is 250 qualifying scores in Masters Jumpers with Weaves and on it goes. It's important to understand, because a MJS3 is 150 more qualifying scores than an MJC.

Now we get to the games and the titles they accumulate. MACH 5 Bozo may have played some T2B. A T2B title is earned by accumulating 100 pts and qualifying in 15 runs. Dogs earn pts in T2B by being faster in their class. The fastest dog in a jump height earns 10 points; dogs within 10% of that time earn nine points, etc.

Then there are the FAST titles. FAST, unlike T2B, has the same four levels as the regular classes: Novice, Open, Excellent and Masters. The game is not offered often, at least not around here, because it is somewhat labor intensive for clubs to put on. Nonetheless, it is a GREAT game for Alaskan malamutes. You get to send them to the next county. Well not quite, but you get the picture. They LOVE it. With three Novice Qs you have and NF or NFP and

on that goes: OF, OFP, XF, XFP and for 10 Qs you have an MXF or MFXP. There are a couple of really zany titles associated with FAST. There is one for 100 Qs in Fast: MCF or something like that and there is one for a dog that qualifies in three classes in one day that include FAST. A TQX means a dog has qualified in Masters Standard, Masters Jumpers with Weaves and Masters FAST all on the same day, ten times. It is so unusual that it is not even calculated on the AKC awards page. They just look every so often and send you the title if you get it. Bozo has a TQX.

The most important thing I hope to communicate, along with helping people to understand what all these letters represent, is that if you have a MXB or and MX, you list it like this: Bozo MXB not Bozo NA, OA, AX, MX, MXB. All the titles prior to the MXB are prerequisite for the MXB, so you don't need to list them. I think people feel the need to do this because many do not understand how much goes into so few letters sometimes. So, at this point Bozo is MACH Bozo MXB. To achieve this, Bozo had to have the MACH, which is 20 double qualifying scores AND 750 pts. Points are earned by the seconds under course time the dog qualifies in. If you qualify a 65 second Standard course in 49.8 seconds, you have earned 15 points, etc. In order to get 20 double qualifying scores, you have probably attended at least 5 days of trialing when you have only earned one qualifying score. An MXB means the dog has qualified in Masters Standard 25 times.

In hoping to clear up confusion, I fear I have created more. Please feel free to contact or message me with questions.

Understanding Obedience Titles by Raissa Hinman

Though agility is more popular these days, the AKC is trying to lure us into more Obedience trialing with a host of new classes and titles. I am certainly an "Obedience Geek" but I know many are not. However, it can open the most intimate conversation and communication with your dog. In any case, if you do want to venture down the obedience trail, there are SO many options that didn't exist a few years ago and I encourage you to do so.

There are still the Regular classes: Novice, Open and Utility with their A and B levels. If you want to compete in the regular classes you need to do so in the proper order. You need three legs for a CD (Companion Dog or Novice title), three legs for a CDX (Companion Dog Excellent or Open) title

and three legs for a UD (Utility Dog title). Only dogs that have completed a UD can compete for OM points (Obedience Master), OTCh pts (Obedience Trial Champion) or a UDX (Utility Dog Excellent). These are all the regular titles. Only the Obedience Trial Championship is earned through actually earning higher scores than the other dogs in Open and Utility B classes. All the other regular titles are about your own performance only.

The newest title in the regular classes is the Obedience Master title or OM. It is wonderful for our Malamutes, many of whom do wonderfully, but rarely beat the goldens and Border Collies. OM points are earned for scores over 190 in the Open B or Utility B class. You need 200 pts for an OM,

60 from Open B. 60 from Utility B. and the rest can come from either class. There is a point schedule. For scores between 190 and 192.5 you earn 6 points, for example. For scores over 197, you earn 15 pts, I believe. There are scores in between worth 9 and 12 pts. Once you earn your Open and Utility title, you are eligible for OM pts. A dog can earn multiple OMs and a dog that has completed 10 OMs has an OGM or Obedience Grand Master title.

The Non-regular classes have no pre-requisites. You can compete in ANY of them without any previous titles. They are as follows: Beginner Novice (BN), Pre Novice (PCD) and Grad Novice (GN). All of these are Suffix titles, to follow, the registered name of the dog. There is also a Pre Open

(PCDX) and Grad Open (GO) and a Pre Utility class (PUTD).

Beginner Novice is a bit like Rally Obedience. There are signs to direct your heeling pattern. There is a sit for exam and a stay exercise where you walk around your dog who should sit in the center of the ring. There is no group stay exercise and you are allowed to give a word of praise during each exercise. In the regular classes you cannot speak to your dog during the exercises except for the initial commands. It's a very nice class for new dogs and handlers.

Pre Novice is more like the regular obedience class, but there is no group stay ex-

ercise. Grad Novice is for people trying to get their dogs ready for the Open class. It is a combination of Novice and Open obedience exercises. Pre Open is exactly like the regular Open class, but you can have lower jump heights and there is no Group Stay exercise. The group stays are unquestionably difficult and can be scary, so this is a good option for folks who like to do Obedience but want to avoid the Group Stays. Pre Utility is similar to Pre Open, in that it is like the regular Utility class but with lower jump heights and is a great option for older dogs too.

There is one more non-regular class that is a favorite of mine. It is not new, but it is a

LOT of fun. It is the Versatility class. (The title is VER). This class requires the dog to perform six exercises, two each from the Novice, Open, and Utility classes. There are no group exercises for Versatility .The dog needs to qualify in this class three times for a title.

Again, I hope this helps any of you who care to sort out these titles, to figure out what you might want to do with your dogs, or to understand what some of your friends are doing. Please feel free to contact me if this is not clear. I have been doing this for years, and might be assuming way too much.

Not just a brag, not just a stepping stone to a higher title, not just an adjunct to competitive scores; a title is a tribute to the dog that bears it, a way to honor the dog, an ultimate memorial. It will remain in the record and in the memory, for about as long as anything in the world can remain. And though the dog herself doesn't know or care that her achievements have been noted, a title says many things in the world of humans, where such things count. A title says your dog was intelligent, adaptable, and good-natured. It says that your dog loved you enough to do the things that please you, however crazy they may have sometimes seemed.

Agility sites and equipment can be very expensive, and these all-breed trials are part of the Agility Committee's work to fund malamute-only trials at AMCA's Regional and National Specialties. Laura Heft put together a plan to use the Club's extra agility licenses to hold all-breed trials, so non-club competitors contribute to AMCA's agility funding. Laura formed profit-sharing partnerships with training clubs in Syracuse NY and Erie PA. Peggy Anderson and BRAGI qualified in both their Excellent Standard runs, and Laura Heft and COBY qualified in both Novice Standard runs and completed their final leg for the Novice Jumpers title.

Meet Bella, AMCA's First Performance-ROM Recipient

To receive a Performance ROM (ROM-PERF), a sire must have five appropriately titled progeny and a dam must have four appropriately titled progeny. A ROM-PERF requires the offspring to have any combination of the minimum requirements for either a ROM-OB (obedience), ROM-RAL (Rally) or ROM-AG (Agility). A CD title or greater is required for a ROM-OB, a RA title or greater for a ROM-RAL, and a minimum of one Open level agility title in regular classes for a ROM-AG.

When the BOD approved the Performance Committee's Performance ROM program, I did not expect there to already be dogs that have met the requirements. I was excited to learn that there are already TWO malamutes who can add ROM-PERF to the end of their names; BELLA, Storm Kloud's As Good As It Gets, owned by Jen Effler, and CRUISER, Mtn Home's Choose to Cruise, owned by Roy and Sue Fuller. Here is Bella's story, as told by Jen Effler.

I never tried doing much agility and rally work with Bella other than just playing at class or on my own equipment in the yard. IKEY ~ U-AGII Powderhound's The Ike-Man Cometh WWPDX WTD WPD RA NAP NJP NFP IDWP3 VAM

The first of her kids I did agility with was Ikey. He was slow and this was good because it gave me time to fumble around and get things right. Given his speed and straighter shoulder, my goal for him was to finish the three Novice titles in Standard, Jumpers,

and FAST...which he did. He also did Rally for me. Some people think it's easy to get Rally titles on a dog. Those people never worked lkey. He liked to get creative and if he came to the start line bouncing and 'boofing', it was going to be a show. My sole Rally NQ came at a trial with him. The sign was "Halt (sit). Front. Right Finish, Halt". He halted ok but when he came around front, he gloriously threw himself into a down. Who does that?! I signaled him to get up so he bounced up into the air from the down, punched me HARD in the chest, I dropped

the leash, and he went and sat about 5 feet away at an angle. I was dumbfounded. When I gained the ability to move my feet, I looked at the judge and said "This isn't happening today." I collected my dog and left. That was going for his RN (Rally Novice) title. Two months before I lost him he finished his Rally Advanced title to complete his VAM requirements with AMCA. He was also an exceptional weight pull dog having won his class at several National specialties and he was a good team dog. Ikey was AGII Powderhound's The Ike-Man Cometh WWPDX WPD WTD RA NAP NJP NFP IDWP3 VAM.



TRAVIS ~ Powderhound's On The Other Hand WWPDX NA NAJ NF CGC

The first agility titles came from Bella's first and second litters, an Ikey littermate named Travis, aka Powderhound's On The Other Hand WWPDX NA NAJ NF CGC, and Layla, aka Powderhound's Woo The Masses WWPDX OA NAJ NF ROMWD. Some of you may have seen Travis at a National. He sticks out being a long coat with enormous coat. Travis is retired from agility but he frequently won the 24" class at all-breed trials. When he was bested, it was often by his half-sister, Layla.



LAYLA ~ Powderhound's Woo The Masses WWPDX OA NAJ NF ROMWD

Layla has more clean runs (perfect score of 100) than any of her siblings. She has also been an exceptional weight puller like lkey, and holds the Amalapac weight pull record of 4,000# with her half-sister, Lucy. Both of them live with and are trained by Dustin Smyka-Warner and Rachel Banks.



BUMPER ~ CH Powderhound's Silver Lining WWPDX WTD WPD RE NFP NJP VAM AAAM

Bumper is the 4th of Bella's agility kids and is still actively competing. He is currently 1 leg shy of his Open Jumpers title which would then qualify Bella for the Agility ROM.

It was good for me to start with Ikey and make my mistakes with the slower dog because Bumper is so fast I would have messed him up badly. He's fast and super attentive, taking the smallest cues. This is a blessing and a curse to run. A slight movement can cause a direction change which turns into a beautiful run or an NQ. I'm hoping to get him to his Excellent titles. He also competes in Rally, having earned his Excellent title. He has started toward his RAE title (sort of a Rally Grand Championship) and has won his class a few times at all-breed trials. A lot of people have said they don't want to train their show dogs to do these things because they believe it will somehow ruin the dog for shows. This is blatantly untrue. The key is to train all of the things at the same time. They're smart, they learn the difference based on the atmosphere, their lead/collar, and your clothing. Bumper has done conformation and rally on the same day even—he doesn't sit in the show ring inappropriately and neither do our other dogs. He needs one more leg for his UKC Rally U-RO1. Bumper is CH Powderhound's Silver Lining WWPDX WTD WPD RE NJP NFP VAM AAAM.



LUCY ~ U-HIT U-CH Powderhound's Blaze of Glory WWPDX WTD WPD CGCA RE IDWP3

Lucy was the first of the Rally titled kids. She started at 6 months and has easily gone through the RN (Rally Novice), RA (Rally Advanced), and RE (Rally Excellent). She has taken time out for litters and showing but she is working on her RAE like Bumper. Lucy earned a High In Trial at her first UKC trial and is 2/3 of the way to her UKC rally U-RO1 title. She is also my primary lead dog and excellent weight puller having pulled 4,000#. Lucy is U-HIT U-CH Powderhound's Blaze of Glory WWPDX WTD WPD CGCA RE IDWP3 (major ptd).

Two more Bella kids are in training and have trialed in Rally hoping to add to the 'count', Buster, U-CH Powderhound's A Force of WON WWPDX WPD CGC, and Gracie, GCH Powderhound's The Leading Lady WWPDX. She had 12 puppies and all but two have titled in at least one venue.



Introduction to Canine Freestyle

For those looking for something a little different to do with a dog of any age, you might want to explore Freestyle. Freestyle is a dance routine done to music of your choosing. The dog works on the handler's left, right, in front and behind. They learn a variety of maneuvers varying in complexity.

Some of the most popular moves include "spin" (circle right) and "reverse" (circle left), which the dog can perform in any of the above positions (on handler's left, right, in front or behind). The handler may also spin/reverse with the dog.

There are many ways for the dog to tran-



sition from one side to the other. Pass is where the dog crosses in front of you in an arch in order to end up on the other side. Cut is where the dog ducks behind the handler, coming up on the other side. Weave is where the dog travels through the handler's legs as the handler steps forward. Or the dog may remain sitting or standing and wait



in position while the handler moves in an arch across the front of the dog, switching sides.

Freestyle can be performed on or off leash. One can start with a treat in the hand that is guiding the dog. As the dog learns the verbal command and visual cue, you wean

off the food lure and go to a variable rate of reinforcement (reward). A routine is usually only about 1-3 minutes long. As you explore different music, it will become obvious that your dog has his or her own preferences and moves accordingly. It is exciting



to watch a dog moving out to music they enjoy!

There are several organizations that offer titling in Freestyle. Rules vary from group to group. Online courses are also available from my instructor, Judy Gamet of Dogs Can Dance (www.dogscandance.com).

THE NOSE KNOWS

Nosework is a sport that allows the dog to use its' highly sensitive nose to locate an odor. Nosework helps build a bond between dog and handler based on trust and cooperation. Through controlled environments, dog and handler are provided repeated opportunities to locate the target. The dogs rely on their natural senses and instincts, while the handlers learn to trust and to 'read' their dogs.

Targets are a small drop of scent, usually no more than a pin head drop. Scents consist of birch, anise, clove, myrrh, vetiver, cypress, and lemon grass. Some of these scent targets can be fresh or aged for several hours. The target is then hidden in a variety of scenarios. These scenarios range from vehicles, containers, interior rooms or exterior areas. Dogs are kept on leash during the trials. Obedience training is not required. Dogs can trial and earn titles in Nosework 1, Nosework 2 and Nosework 3. A dog has to pass an odor recognition test before it is allowed to trial. Each title level has its' own scent. Nosework 1 scent is birch. Each trial is a timed event. A container search consists of a dozen containers such as boxes which the dog has to search to find the scent target. For vehicles, the target may be hidden anywhere on the vehicle except for the interior. An interior search is a room with many objects or pieces of furniture. The exterior search has the target hidden somewhere within an outside area such as a court yard.

Any breed and type of dog can participate in nose work. Because there is only a single dog in the search area at a time, a shy or dog aggressive dog can take part in nosework.

Training a dog usually starts with pairing a toy or food with a scent (birch). The dog learns to recognize the target scent and is rewarded with the food or toy. Boxes are the container of choice to start training a dog. The training period also allows the handler to introduce a search command to the dog. This word can be 'search', 'find', 'locate or any other word the handler chooses. It is also a time when the handler learns to read the dog and recognize the signal the dog gives when the target has been located. It is recommended that the handler keeps verbal commands to a minimum so as not to distract the dog.

Nosework is beneficial to both the handler and the dog in many ways:

 builds a bond between handler and dog

- · good for new dogs and rescues
- builds confidence in the dog
- provides an outlet for high energy dogs

Nosework venues are provided by the UKC, National Association of Canine Scent Work, and C-WAGS.

Nosework is a great sport for any dog. This includes disabled dogs and well as blind or deaf dogs. It allows the dog to use its' own









natural abilities at a relaxed pace.

HIDDEN REWARDS GAME

Many years ago, my first Competition Obedience Instructor, Adele Yunck showed me a version of this game. I have played with it A LOT and refined it, for the purpose of getting a food crazy Alaskan malamute to stay with me for an entire Utility class. Discussions with Brenda Aloff about impulse control and reinforcement schedules have helped a lot too.

Do you aspire to show in Obedience or Rally and have a dog that doesn't think heeling is the "bees knees"? You don't have a retriever? Your dog thinks that if you threw it, YOU should go get it? Meaning running after a glove, or scent article or dumbbell is not what they most want to do today. How do you get dogs like these into the show ring looking like they are having a good time because they are? While there is, of course, no one single piece of work that will fix all of this attitude problem, the Hidden Rewards game is a very important part of the conversation that we call "dog training."

If your dog is very dependent on food in your hand for heeling, begin like this: Take a yummy piece of cheese or kibble. Show it to your dog. Put it in a container or bait bag that you can open easily, but would hinder your dog, in case he should grab it, uninvited. Put it on a table. Step in front of the table, your back to the table and the Hidden Reward (HR). Ask your dog for some behavior she knows VERY well. A "set up" for heeling with nice attention would be perfect.

You are now standing in front of the table. The dog might be thinking about that good piece of kibble behind him. You can have food on you, but do not show it to the dog. If you use a bait bag, take it off and put it far away out of sight. Eventually you will play the game with no food in your pockets, either. If you can get your dog to sit next to you and look at you, mark this behavior with whatever word you have for "AWESOME DOG". Run back to the table with your dog and tell your dog to "sit" because in this case it is important that, as I have been told many times by Brenda Aloff, "The cookie goes to the dog, not the dog to the cookie". Feed him the treat or treats that are in the container on the table. Praise your dog!!

Do this a few times, until you have very quick "set ups". Only do it about three times if your dog "gets" it before upping the ante. That is the biggest mistake most of us make in our training, and how you got to this place to begin with, where your dog only wants to work with food on your person. We get a behavior that is not the finished product and stick with whatever reinforcement schedule and delivery we used in teaching that behavior. It's dangerous. Most of us have learned the hard way.

Now, set up your dog and give your dog whatever cue you use to begin heeling. If your dog moves out with enthusiasm and you have JUST EXACTLY the perfect behavior

you want in the show ring, run back and get that treat. Do not forget the "sit". Impulse control is a crucial part of this exercise too.

If you don't get that, try again. When you get it, GO FOR IT! Again, don't forget to praise at the moment you get the behavior you want, before running back for the treat. After you get two steps, go for four steps and five steps. Pretty soon you will be doing a whole heeling exercise. At this point the game MUST become more random. Reward and run back only for moments of excellence. This is ONE thing I do. There are others too. This is just a beginning.
